About the Keynote Speakers:

Zhou Zhixing is the CEO of Consensus Media Group. He also is the founder of Leaders magazine(领导者杂志) and Consensus Net (共识网). Zhou began his career at the Central Party Literature Research Office (中共中央文献研究室), conducting research on former president Liu Shaoqi. He was the leading force behind the establishment of its Central Documents Publishing House (中央文献出版). Zhou was one of the key creators of the landmark documentary "Deng Xiaoping" 《邓小平》, co-produced by the Central Party Literature Research Office and China Central Television 《中央电视台》. He served as executive editor of the book "My Father Deng Xiaoping" 《我的父亲邓小平》 by Deng Rong.

In the mid-1990s, Zhou turned his attention to the media. For seven years he was an executive at Phoenix TV, where he founded and was the first editor-in-chief of Phoenix Weekly (凤凰周刊). He also served as editor-in-chief of ifeng.com, the official website of Phoenix TV.

Pei Minxin is the Tom and Margot Pritzker '72 Professor of Government at Claremont McKenna College, a nonresident senior fellow at the German Marshall Fund of the United States, and director of the Keck Center for International and Strategic Studies

His research has been published in Foreign Policy, Foreign Affairs, The National Interest, Modern China, China Quarterly, Journal of Democracy and many edited books. His op-eds have appeared in the Financial Times, The New York Times, Washington Post, Newsweek International and International Herald Tribune, among other major newspapers.
